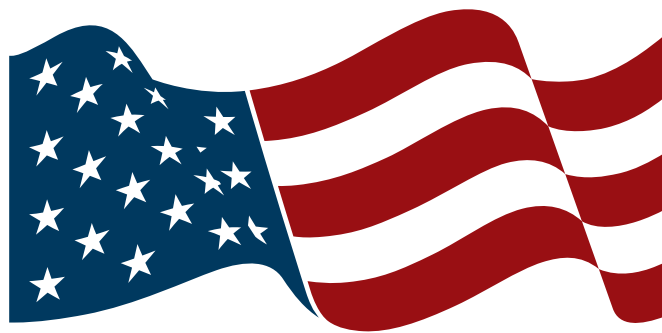

Glen Aleo

Navy: 1985 - 1989

Navy Reserve: 2003 - Present

Glen joined the Navy in 1985 and served four years of active duty as an electrician on a guided missile cruiser. The events of 9-11 made him consider reenlisting and after the Iraq War began in 2003, Glen recounts that he “got this

surge of patriotism and felt like I could still contribute to the effort, so I went to see a recruiter”. At the time, Glen had been working at USF as a maintenance technician and, not wanting to quit his job, asked the recruiter about opportunities in the Navy Reserve. With his background, the recruiter suggested the Navy Seabees, the combat engineers of the Navy, who were looking for construction electricians. Four months later Glen says he was “in the desert” on the first of two one-year deployments. In Iraq, he was part of a Seabees reconnaissance team, attached to a Marine Corps unit. Their job was to evaluate bridges “because if you want to disable a bridge, you send in the people that build bridges”. Glen says during those long deployments you really miss home.

Glen is still in the Navy Reserve. He says that at 56 years old most people in the

military are younger than him, but he feels like he can still contribute and loves the opportunity to serve. Currently, he is a member of the Honor Guard. This role, Glen says, “gives me the opportunity to bid farewell to Navy veterans that have passed, I get to learn about their service and really get a lot out of being on the Honor Guard, it is a real privilege”.

The thing that Glen would like his coworkers across Administrative Services to know about his service in the Navy and Navy Reserve is that he is grateful for being able to serve. “I loved every minute of it”, Glen says, “I loved the camaraderie. I’ve had the opportunity to work with amazing men and women over the years, a lot of them are heroes who very, very much impressed me.” Glen says that as a member of the military, regardless of what branch you were in, it’s like a family.

Her favorite memory of her time in the Coast Guard was when she joined the team to escort the remains of astronaut John Glenn from Dover Air Force Base to Arlington National Cemetery. John Glen was the third American in space, and the first American to orbit the Earth. Teri is proud of her time in the Coast Guard as it made her feel a part of something bigger than herself.
