PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

CAMP provides financial assistance and support services to full-time, first year in college (FTIC) students who meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Have worked for at least 75 days in the past 24 months as a seasonal/migrant farmworker or who are the children of individuals who have worked at least 75 days in the past 24 months as a seasonal/migrant worker.
- Have participated in a Title 1 Migrant Education Program or who are eligible to participate
- Have qualified in the past and/or are currently qualified for the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title I Sec. 167
