- Any university-sponsored travel, whether international or domestic is prohibited
- For university travel related to critical grant funded research, training or programs
 - Submit an exception request to USF COVID-19 taskforce
- Any personal travel remains strongly discouraged per CDC and FDOH
- Vaccination is strongly encouraged

OIS UPDATE

State Department National Exception Waivers 4/26/21

Who: students with approved or valid F-1 student visas

Where: China, Iran, Brazil, South Africa, United Kingdom, Ireland and Schengen (Europe) Area.

What: Can enter the US for Fall without seeking special permission to travel.

Students stuck outside the US who have visas can return to USF for study in the Fall.



On April 26, 2021, SEVP confirmed that the March 2020 Guidance would still apply for 2021/2022.

Fall 2021 will mirror Fall 2020 & Spring 2021

- Continuing F-1 students in the US are not restricted to taking only one online course
- Continuing F-1 students outside the US are able to maintain their F-1 status while in all online courses.
- Incoming new F-1 students need to enroll in at least one face to face course.






2020 USF PUBLICATION PROFILE


**Total # of publications,



Dr. Smith served as principal investigator of a study entitled Assessing Nurses Risk of Exposure to Blood Borne Pathogens in Sub-Saharan Africa. Dr. Smith also served as a faculty member for a WHO Safe Motherhood survey in Malawi and Kenya. As both a Nurse and an Exercise Physiologist, Dr. Smith has conducted RCTs related to chronically ill adults and children's interventions. She was a Technical Advisor and the Director of the Nursing Component of the University of Maryland Institute for Human Virology, President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) grant, which served 7 countries in Africa and 2 countries in the Caribbean and provided technical assistance related to HIV care and treatment to nurses and other Health Care Workers (HCW). She was appointed as an Adjunct Professor at the University of Malawi, Kamuzu College of Nursing, Lilongwe, Malawi, and recently served as a Visiting Professor, Chiang Mai Thailand. She is currently a CoPI on an NCI funded exercise intervention in Head and Neck cancer patients following treatment.

Role of Mathematical Models in Forecasting and Management of the COVID-19 Pandemic

Dr. Edwin Michael is an epidemiologist who studies the spread and control of global infectious diseases, including population ecology, epidemiology, dynamics, and control of neglected tropical diseases. Most recently his work focuses on SARS-CoV-2 and the COVID-19 pandemic. A common theme across his research is a focus on the development and implementation of novel analytical and computational approaches for providing a deeper understanding of the determinants, pathways, and dynamics of disease transmission in endemic communities and using the insights gained for identifying and analyzing sustainable approaches to disease control. Currently, he leads the development of the SIRCART COVID-19 modeling portal for supporting population-level response and hospital surge planning to contain the pandemic at the county level in Tampa Bay.
