CAPTURING USF'S GLOBAL FOOTPRINT



USF World is dedicated to tracking and mapping USF's global initiatives, programs, research, and the international mobility of faculty and students. During the 2023-2024 academic year, **2,571** students, faculty, and staff traveled to **103** different countries.

The Global Discovery Hub, a publicly available interactive online application, maps student, faculty, and partnership activity. It includes current institutional partnerships and surveys the existing range of global activities faculty are engaged in throughout the world, including publications with international co-authors. The hub also allows students to create international activity resumes to highlight their global achievements.





USF World further supports the university's colleges by creating annual global engagement reports that help the university map its global footprint and better understand its global reach. These reports provide comprehensive data evaluation of the many ways colleges and programs demonstrate global activity, including inbound and outbound student mobility, faculty enagagement information, and institutional partnerships. USF community members can access this information in the reporting section of the USF World website at www.usf.edu/world. The USF "Passport" is a resource designed specifically for faculty interested in beginning or furthering their global engagement activities.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AND STUDY ABROAD PARTICIPANTS CONTRIBUTE TO USF'S KEY PERFORMANCE METRICS

Students who engage globally, either as international students at USF and/or as participants in outbound study abroad programs, enhance the campus environment by contributing to the diversity of thought within the classroom and on campus. Globally engaged students not only bring the world to campus communities, they also contribute to key USF performance metrics and consistently perform higher than average on State of Florida benchmarks.



The office administers four School of Record transcripting operations, enhancing the national and international profile of USF.






Technologically-assisted intercultural exchange

The pandemic expedited the development of virtual global exchanges and collaborative online international learning. During the 2023-2024 academic year, more than **550** USF students participated in a virtual global learning experience. The online Global Career Accelerator Program allows students to learn about data analytics, digital marketing, or coding by engaging in hands-on internship opportunities in an intercultural environment. Faculty-led Virtual Global Exchanges bring together students from USF with their peers abroad to engage in collaborative learning and research.

In collaboration with the Center for Innovative Teaching & Learning (CITL), USF World launched a VGE faculty learning community (FLC) in 2023 to provide training and partnering assistance to 14 faculty members. USF faculty offered 21 VGE courses this year linking their classrooms with partner classrooms around the globe. These classes were taught by 12 trained faculty and enrolled 367 students in the 2023-24 academic year. The program was such as success that it will continue in 2024-25 with 21 new participants currently registered. Professors who choose to incorporate a virtual competent into their classes receive specialized training and a small \$1200 stipend from USF World.

INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP



USF has been a leading producer of Fulbright Scholar Awards since 2015. A dedicated Faculty Fulbright Advisor offers Spring and Summer workshops for faculty interested in applying for a Fulbright Award. USF faculty are highly competitive and successful with Fulbright applications.

In 2022-2023, the university was recognized as a Top Producer of student Fulbright Awards for the first time in its history. The Office of National Scholarships supports students interested in applying for this highly prestigious award.



ENSURING IMMIGRATION COMPLIANCE

The Office of International Services facilitates the understanding and compliance of federal immigration regulations and university policies for international students, scholars, faculty, and staff. Services offered include:

- Management of Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) records for F-1 students, including reporting requirements and redesignation filing
- Oversight of the university's J-1 Exchange Visitor Program
- Filing of the annual Institute of International Education Open Doors student data report
- Delivery of new student workshops about immigration responsibilities and campus involvement
- Specialized immigration appointments to discuss status concerns and work authorization
- Facilitation for international students and scholars to file their U.S. taxes
- Collaboration with departments that sponsor non-immigrant visas and permanent residency for USF employees



J-1 VISITOR EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Bringing Talented Students & Researchers to Campus

The objective of the J-1 Exchange Visitor Program, known as BridgeUSA, is "to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and the people of other countries by means of educational and cultural exchanges" (Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act also known as the Fulbright-Hayes Act of 1961). The Program is designed for people outside of the U.S. who wish to take part in study- and work-related exchange programs approved by the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. **During the 2023-2024 academic year, 210 visiting J-1 international scholars represented 46 countries and contributed to the vitality of USF as a global university.**


USF (including USF Health) has **172** active institutional partnership agreements across **53** countries. These include:

The International Community Relations Team oversees outreach across USF's three campuses, Tampa Bay's international and business communities, and USF's alumni and partners abroad. The unit:

- Leads USF's relations with Tampa Bay's international business and diplomatic communities
- Builds and leverages relationships with USF's global alumni
- Brings students, faculty, and alumni together around geo-cultural areas of interest through Global Networks
- Manages international visitor and delegation protocol
- Promotes USF's international success and global impact through outreach and communications
- Builds global reputation, brand awareness, and media coverage



International Business Forum



Impactful engagement with the local community is critical to the university's 2022-27 Strategic Plan. The USF World Advisory Council facilitates collaboration and capitalizes on opportunities for globalization at USF and across the Tampa Bay region. The council's mission is to provide USF World with guidance, support, and advocacy to help build mutually beneficial relationships with key stakeholders in Tampa Bay's international community and beyond.

The Council successfully led the university's first International Business Forum in March of 2024 — a collaboration between USF World, the Muma College of Business, and The Office of University Community Partnerships. In a daylong event on April 10, more than 200 people came together at the USF International Business Forum to take stock of the region's potential as a gateway to the global economy. "Florida is a magnet for business and top talent," USF President Rhea Law told the crowd gathered at the Marshall Student Center. "Last year we had an 86% net gain in business coming here ... that's the largest in the country. We have something very special going on in our state, and in particular we have something very special going on in Tampa Bay. We have the environment, we have the ecosystem that will support these businesses, and we do that together because we link arms and make sure we take care of those businesses."
