USF does **NOT** allow the establishment of joint degrees or dual degrees.

Discussions about resources, financials, academics, among others, are essential, so you enter into a clear understanding of what is needed before making commitments or creating any expectations about the possibilities of signing an agreement. As sponsor, it is your responsibility to inform the appropriate chair/director, dean, and global college representative about the proposal.

Mrs. Morales will be also the point of contact for questions regarding the process. USF World will work with the Office of Undergraduate or Graduate Studies, Office of Admissions and the USF's Accreditation Liaison/Academic Planning for review and consideration. Please remember, this multi-step process may take anywhere from a few weeks to several months, so we encourage faculty/staff to plan ahead and be proactive in the preparation and submission of documents.
