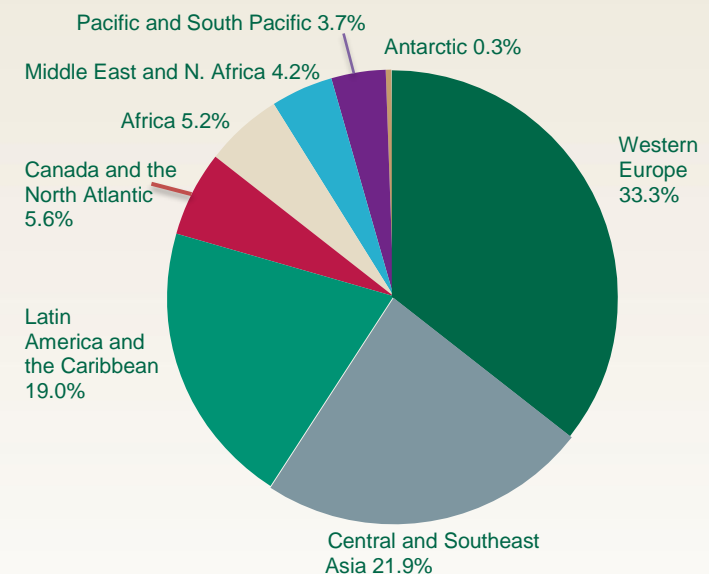
Engage

The *Faculty* [and Staff] module showcases your international engagement and allows you to share information pertaining to your post-baccalaureate education received outside the U.S., international research, teaching and training, creative endeavors, professional service and consulting, as well as global awards and honors. Users are able to identify possible collaborators, individuals with particular language or geographic expertise, and can be notified of internationally funded opportunities in their geographical or discipline area(s) of expertise.

The *Summary* module links everything together to provide a comprehensive overview of USF's engagement by country – including faculty/staff, student, and partnership information.

To access the Global Discovery Database, visit www.usf.edu/gdh and:

- Please “Sign in” at upper right corner of the page – use your USF NetID to access the site
- Your profile will automatically be created and pre-populated with your NetID information when you do so. You will find yourself on your profile home page at this point and can begin to add your activities (see right).
- From the home page (below), you can explore USF partnerships, plot your global footprint in the *Faculty* section, learn about USF's student mobility, and view summary reports for USF activity abroad.

Plot Your Global Footprint...

- Any activity information that is added to your profile in the Database will be displayed on the faculty “Map” by location.



- To add an activity to your profile, simply click on “[Your NetID] - My Profile” in the upper right hand corner of the site after logging in.
- Select the “My Activities” tab in the tan header bar above your basic profile information.

- Click on the “Add an activity” button and add the required information to begin your list of international activities.
