Update From the Vice President



As this edition of the USF World newsletter arrives, I will be in Japan with a delegation of university and community leaders led by USF President Rhea Law and Tampa Mayor Jane Castor visiting Tokyo, Gifu, and Osaka. As the Tampa Bay Region rises in the global economy, visits like this one are invaluable in solidifying relationships that create opportunities at the intersection of education, innovation and research, and economic development. Florida and Japan have deep economic ties. A 2023 Memorandum of Cooperation on Economic and Trade Relations signed between the governments of Japan and the State of Florida highlights the importance of our international alliance. The objective of the Memorandum is to

strengthen the bilateral ties shared by Japan and Florida in the following areas: infrastructure and ground transportation; aerospace, aviation, and defense; logistics; clean energy; life sciences and biotechnology; academic cooperation; and sister cities, sister states, and sister port partnerships.

On this mission, we'll be connecting with institutions and organizations who have been valued partners to USF in student exchange programs, particularly in the health education and cultural and language studies. We'll also be establishing ties with several new institutions and organizations who are eager to discover all USF, and the wider Tampa Bay Region can offer. A key focus of this trip will be life sciences innovation driven by the ground-breaking work by our colleagues at USF Health and **partners at Tampa General Hospital** who have been driving the development of the **Tampa Medical and Research District** – a life sciences destination for innovation and discovery in downtown Tampa. We are particularly interested in collaborating with industry leaders in Japan to enhance access to cutting-edge research and education for patients and students.

Among the Japanese institutions our delegation will visit are:

Link-J: Life Science Innovation Network Japan

Members of the delegation will participate in a seminar devoted to exploring business and research opportunities across the Tampa Medical and Research District and Japan's Life Science Innovation Network. You can learn more about this event **here**.

Kansai Gaidai University: One of two exchange programs in Japan open to USF students across all majors, Kansai Gaidai's strategic importance centers on the breadth of coursework available in business, social sciences, and humanities. USF's relationship with Kansai dates to 1993, and its location between Kyoto and Osaka places students in an urban center important for Japanese commerce, history, culture, and politics. USF's other exchange partner, Akita International University, is an English-taught program focusing on business and international studies.

Gifu University: Since 2015, USF's College of Public Health exchange program with the Gifu, located in central Japan, has allowed 76 USF students to study in one of the healthiest countries in the world. Medical students from Gifu also have traveled to Tampa as part of clinical clerkship exchange agreement.

Toyko Women's Medical University: While our partnership with Tokyo Women's Medical University is relatively recent (2024), it is already making an impact. Three USF Health students have traveled to TWMU, and this summer, we look forward to welcoming our first two students from Tokyo Women's Medical University to USF.

We have much to learn from each other, and these exchanges accrue benefits not just for our students and faculty but for the long-term health and prosperity of our wider community. And I am thrilled so many in our business community are eager to expand their own insights into our shared global future.


